



FACILITATOR

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
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- In the beginning, God created man in his own image and likeness for man to have dominion, commune with and worship God
- The sin of Adam and Eve caused all people to be separated from God. Despite this, God set forth a plan to redeem mankind from the power of Sin and restore them to Himself
- The church is a creation of God and is designed by him to seek the lost people, buy them back from the Kingdom of darkness, translate them to the Kingdom of light and nurture them as they grow in the Faith
- Individuals are called to be part of and participate in the Body of Christ, this being the Church
- All believers of Christ are assigned the Great Commission that demands of them to be his Witness and make Disciples across the earth

HOLY SPIRIT
EMPOWERING
MISSION


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- Before Jesus ascended to heaven, he instructed his disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they received a helper. The promised helper was received at Pentecost through the dramatic infilling of the Holy Spirit.
- •God the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, fully God, equal to and has always existed with God the Father and God the Son. He is a personal being, not just a force.
- The Holy Spirit has several roles in a believer's life including but not limited to sanctification and transformation towards a becoming Christ-like, enable communication with God, provision of guidance and comfort amidst difficulties, empowerment for service and the guarantee of a reward in Heaven.
- The Holy Spirit is necessary for the Church to be united in community and for individuals to be empowered in fulfilling their divine mission in life
- The Holy Spirit enabled the early Church to draw closer, be united and share resources amongst themselves. He enabled Peter, John and Stephen to speak before the religious councils. He gave Phillip supernatural speed and enabled many miracles to occur.



- 5. Share with your fellow group members a personal experience you have had with the Holy Spirit?





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
WEEK 3 – LESSON 3
THE NATURE OF
THE CHURCH

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
- God created people in his image to have dominion over the earth and to commune with fellow people and himself
- God revealed the Church as his vehicle to create community though unity in the Body of Christ
- The early Church exemplified the unity in community through devotion to teaching, meeting, sharing, generosity and many other good deeds.
- The early Church's commitment was centered on Love for God and one's neighbour
- At Karura Community Chapel, our core values are based on;
 - **a. Love** commitment to the Great Command to love God and to love our neighbours (Luke 10: 25-37)
 - **b. Transformatio**n commitment to Biblical transformation (Rom 12: 1-2, Col 1: 28-29)
 - c. Leadership Commitment to empowering leadership (Eph 4: 11-12)
 - d. Relevance Commitment to Contextual Relevance (1 Cor 9: 19-23)
 - e. Church Planting commitment to church planting (Matt 28: 19-20)

- **f. Prayer** we believe that successful ministry is dependent on God, and so foundation to the above is a commitment to prayer, the truth of God's Word, and seeking God's presence and enablement by the Holy Spirit (John 14 17, Rom 8: 5–17, Phil 2; 13)
- The Lord sets on his believers a duty to one another within the Body of Christ and empowers them through the Holy Spirit to do his work.

DON'T BE SUPRISED

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
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- Many believers in the early Church suffered persecution for the sake of Jesus Christ
- Persecution for Jesus' sake is inevitable due to the evil in the world
- God provides patience, wisdom and joy to encourage a person undergoing persecution
- Perseverance amidst persecution helps a believer to grow into spiritual maturity
- God has a glorious reward for those who undergo persecution for his sake

- What will you do this week to encourage a fellow believer who is undergoing persecution?






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WEEK 5 – LESSON 5
EMERGENCE OF
LEADERSHIP

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- We are called to lead, inspire and serve others, guided by God, while using our skills and talents.
- Effective Christian leadership requires reliance on the Holy Spirit, for Wisdom, Discernment, and Direction to lead others towards God's Will
- We ought to devote ourselves to extend grace to others, build consensus and problem solve constructively, in order to strengthen the Church
- Leaders must address conflict constructively, through active listening, honest dialogue and balanced judgements
- For successful implementation of decisions, leaders should communicate clearly the rationale behind the decision as well as each stakeholder's role and tasks
- Effective leaders delegate to skilled and able persons, empowering them to take ownership, to enable the leader to focus on core responsibilities
- Leaders should create clear succession plans, identify and mentor potential successors to ensure a seamless transfer of leadership
